- Wednesday, July 22,2020: Richmond Elementary summarized those guidelines and posted them on our website on with Richmond's Reopening and Distance Learning Survey #1 to help us understand our community's thoughts and concerns as we being the process of reopening and establishing next steps

Facility-Planning Questions

- Role in school
- Number of children at school
- Grade span of child/ children
- Chrome book needs
- Internet access / needs
- Child care concerns
- School lunch needs
- Wish to be contacted immediately by Superintendent/ Principal of Richmond Elementary

School Programmatic Questions

- What is the probability of your child attending school on Day 1?
- What support do you imagine your child will need in returning to school?
- How was distance learning for your child?
- What concerns do you have about your child's learning progress?
- What concerns do you have about your child's social-emotional well bring?
- How can we help your child have a supportive school year?

Facility-Planning Questions Results

- Role in school
 - 91 Parents; 2 Teachers; 1 Paraprofessional; 1 Board Member
- Number of children at school
 - One child = 45 respondents
 - Two Children = 36 respondents
 - Three or More = 10 respondents
- Grade span of child/ children
 - Tk-2nd Grade = 46
 - 3-5th Grade = 47
 - **►** 6-8th Grade = 40
- Chrome book needs
 - 39% Need Chrome
 - ► 24% Might Need Chrome

- Internet access / needs
 - 98.9% Have internet
- Child care concerns
 - 25% = Childcare concern
 - 18% = Might be a concern
- School lunch needs
 - ► 65% = Both school and home lunch
 - ► 7% School lunch only
- Wish to be contacted immediately by Superintendent/ Principal of Richmond Elementary
 - 98% = No
 - \rightarrow 2% = Yes

Question Asked:

What is the probability of your child attending school on Day 1?

Very Likely to Return on Day! = 66%

- Somewhat likely to Return on Day 1 = 17%
- **Probably not likely** to Return to oncampus instruction = 14%

• **Definitely not likely** to Return to oncampus Instruction = 3%

Question Asked:

What support do you imagine your child will need in returning to school?

Responses were:

Provide School Expectations/ Requirements = 11
Student and staff safety = 7
Learning Loss = 3
Be understanding and flexible during these times = 6
Social Distance and Face Covering Discipline Concerns = 3
Children not tolerating masks; are face shields ok? = 3

Increase school communication = 2
Distance learning = daily check-ins with teachers (2)

Family will not participate = 2
Increased stress on students = 1

How was distance learning (DL) for your child?

Make Zoom more effective; Actual lessons; Clearer expectations and Guidance/ Daily Check Ins = 8
Student lack of motivation = 7
Increase daily support to families from staff = 6
Chrome Book/ Internet Concerns = 5

Be flexible when a student struggle/ excels; differentiate = 3
Daily DL requirements and daily teacher check ins = 3
Include social aspects in DL = 3

Special needs concerns = 2 Less busy work; Just do basics = 2 Coordinate teacher Zoom schedule to avoid overlap = 2 Record short lessons to watch = 2
